

Sam Schacht is back at CMPS to edit, direct, and stage this absurdist two-character play by Eugene Ionesco. Ionesco referred to "The Chairs," written and debuted in 1952, as a tragic farce. In the program for the original production, lonesco writes, "As the world is incomprehensible to me, I am waiting for someone to explain it." As the idea of a theatre of the absurd evolved as a literary form

that explored the futility and loneliness of human existence, "The Chairs" came to be seen as a seminal example of the genre. The play is a bleak yet comedic metaphor for human existence, much like the genre of Chaplin films. Renowned actors Rita Gardner and Ken Kimmins return to the CMPS stage to star in this production.

Director/Editor/Producer: Sam Schacht, MA, LP, is a CMPS graduate, a producer, a theatre academic, and an instructor at the Stella Adler Studio of Acting. This production begins his eighth year editing and directing theatrical events for the CMPS stage.

Rita Gardner is an American actress and singer who made her stage debut as Luisa in the original cast of "The Fantasticks" and has continued her career working in the New York theatre, in regional theatre in Washington, DC and Pennsylvania, and on television.

Ken Kimmins is an actor, director, and writer who has appeared in numerous Broadway shows, including the Broadway and London productions of Sondheim's "Company" with Elaine Stritch. His long list of TV roles includes appearing with Larry David in "Curb Your Enthusiasm," as Dr Klein on "Lois and Clark," and perhaps his most famous role as Howard Burleigh, Athletic Director of Minnesota State University, in the hit show "Coach."
