Winnicott believed that if the analyst could not play, he or she was not fit for the job; if the patient could not play, analysis could not begin. What feelings are aroused when we start to play or write or paint? What are we resurrecting that allows us to revel in or causes us to avoid the transitional space between reality and fantasy? This workshop is for those interested in exploring their creative impulses and patterns as well as the defenses that have evolved to ensure that the creative core of the personality is protected.

INTERACTIVE WORKSHOP IN COUPLES THERAPY

A workshop for clinicians and all those interested presents a modern analytic approach to the "how to and why" of couples treatment.
