Fall 2010 Semester Registration Information

Semester Course Schedule

The Fall 2010 semester begins September 13; classes end December 16. This semester, two one-week vacation periods are scheduled. See calendar on page 6.

Registration

The tuition for full-time enrollment is **\$3,000**. This includes 4 or more courses plus one PT 111 or one PT 211, but not PT 490 Referral Service Semiannual Lab Fee. The minimum tuition for students in their first or second semester is **\$750**. This amount covers one course but does not include the \$100 registration fee. The minimum tuition for Level 1 students (Matriculants) and Level 2 students (Certificate Candidates) is **\$1,500**. This amount covers one or two courses but excludes clinical supervision (PT 111, PT 211, or PT 611), the \$100 registration fee, and the PT 490 Referral Service Semiannual Lab Fee. The minimum tuition for Level 3 students (Research Candidates) is \$1150. This amount does not cover clinical supervision (PT 311, PT 411, or PT 611), the \$100 registration fee, or the PT 490 Referral Service Semiannual Lab Fee.

Students confer with their Advisors or Fellows during the registration process since **completion of registration is contingent upon having obtained the Advisor's signature**. At the Referral Service level the student's Fellow acts as academic advisor. Students in good standing who meet the PT 7 Training Analysis requirement submit their advisor-approved registration forms to the CMPS registrar. A **\$100 late fee** will be charged for tuition received **after September 3, 2010**. Payment of *only* the \$100 registration fee on or before **September 3, 2010** does not cancel this fee. Students use the registration form to indicate the courses they wish to take in the Fall semester, giving at least 2 choices for PT 111/211 and including the name of their PT 7 analyst. Candidates who are in approved PT 311/411 indicate the name of the supervisor(s).

Students submit the registration form with all tuition checks, indicating current home, cell, and office telephone numbers, email address, and any address changes. Email addresses are particularly important because the Center communicates with students on a variety of important matters through email.

Registration forms are processed only if tuition and the completed PT 7 form are included, and if all materials have been returned to the library. Certificate and Research Candidates must be current with their monthly room reports. Class and supervisory sections are confirmed upon receipt of tuition. Students are advised to register as soon as possible to ensure that they receive their course selections and to avoid the \$100 late fee (for registrations received after **September 3, 2010**).

The \$100 registration fee covers library services, journal subscription, Center ID card, and all Center mailings.

Fall 2010 Tuition Payment Program

The Center has a deferred payment program to assist those students who would find such a plan helpful. Students may make up to **three approximately equal tuition payments**. The amount of each check must be **at least \$200**, with **the last dollar digit ending in a "0" or a "5."** The first check is to be dated when the registration form is returned to the Registrar's office. The second and third checks are to be dated October 13, 2010, and November 13, 2010. The processing fee is \$30.00 for this three-check option. There is also a two-check option which costs \$15.00, where the first check is dated when the registration form is returned and the second check is dated October 13, 2010. **All checks must accompany the registration form, including the post-dated checks.**

PT 7/ PT 8 Analyst Statement

Included with the registration material is a PT 7 /PT 8 analyst's statement. The form is to be signed by the training analyst(s) and returned with the registration form **every semester**.

Field Placement Program

After consulting with their educational advisors, Level 1 students (Matriculants) begin the CMPS Clinical Studies sequence by enrolling in PT 184 Primitive Mental States. During the first eight weeks of PT 184, students planning to begin their fieldwork placement in the following semester complete an **Application to Begin Fieldwork Placement** and schedule an interview with the CMPS Fieldwork Placement Coordinator. While a student in PT 184, the student visits three mental health facilities to become acquainted with the general atmosphere of these institutions. Following completion of PT 184 and approval of the Application, the student begins the placement by enrolling in the first of three semesters of PT 185 Clinical Experience in Institutional Settings and PT 111 Fieldwork Placement Case Supervision. The CMPS Fieldwork Placement Coordinator assists the student in selecting one of the available placement options or in developing an alternative placement. A minimum of 15 hours of PT 7 Training Analysis is required. Students who have completed two semesters of PT 185 may register for PT 186 Beyond Psychosis: Typology of Conflict and Defense concurrently with their third semester of PT 185.

Referral Service: Beginning Certificate Candidacy

Level 1 students seeking to begin work at the Referral Service work with their advisors to complete the Application for Certificate Candidacy. Admission to Certificate Candidacy requires approval of the advisor, completion of all Level 1 courses, the fieldwork placement, and a minimum of 100 hours of approved training analysis. Students in their first year at the Referral Service register for PT 490 Referral Service Lab; PT 2610 Beginning Treatment: Psychopathology & Psychodiagnosis; PT 211 Supervision of Cases; and other core curriculum courses necessary to complete their programs.

Referral Service: Supervision requirements

All Consultation and Referral Service candidates (Level 2 and Level 3 students) are in approved clinical supervision with a minimum frequency of one hour supervision per week. Frequency and amount of supervision is determined in consultation with the fellow, generally at the ratio of one supervisory hour to each four hours of patient contact. These requirements can be met in a variety of ways:

- Candidates in the first year at the Referral Service enroll in **PT 211, Small Group Supervision of Referral Service Cases**. PT 211 sections meet once weekly during the semester and eight times during the summer; each section covers a maximum of three cases per supervisee. Supervision focuses on the beginning stages of conducting psychoanalysis.
- After completing a minimum two semesters of PT 211, candidates, in consultation with the fellow, may apply to begin supervision in **PT 311, Individual Supervision of Consultation and Referral Service Cases**. With fellow approval, the candidate arranges PT 311 individually with an approved supervisor. Supervision with another PT 311 supervisor may be added for coverage of more patients. *Candidates continue in at least one PT 311 until graduation.*
- Candidates apply for **PT 411, Control Analysis of a Consultation and Referral Service Case**, in consultation with their Fellow when the candidate has developed sufficient clinical experience and has a case appropriate for research. The candidate arranges PT 411 individually with an approved supervisor, the control analyst. Frequency of PT 411 supervisory sessions is determined between candidate and supervisor, while meeting the standard of one hour of supervision to four hours of patient contact.
- Upon advisement, candidates may get additional supervision for up to 3 patients in **PT 611, Small Group Supervision of Referral Service Cases (Supplemental)**. Each PT 611 section is limited to 3 supervisees. PT 611 is offered each semester and summer through the registrar. PT 611 is not a substitute for PT 311, *but an addition to it.*

Referral Service Lab Fee

Referral Service candidates register for PT 490 Referral Service Lab. The Referral Service Lab fee is divided into two semiannual payments of \$475 for first year students, and two semiannual payments of \$525 beginning with the second year. The fee covers room use for **five** scheduled referrals, weekly consultation with the Fellow, and telephone answering service. Candidates who wish to treat more than 3 patients may ask their fellows to assign them additional cases.

Curriculum for Research Candidates

Students are designated **Research Candidates** upon successful completion of all Level 1 and Level 2 courses, a minimum of 25 hours of PT 411 Control Analysis, and a clinical presentation to the faculty. Research Candidates are required to take two courses *every semester*: **a research course** (PT 524a Research Practicum and Ethics, PT 524b Findings in Psychoanalytic Research and Ethics, or PT 527 Research Supervision, six 50-minute sessions of individual work with a Research Supervisor scheduled approximately every two weeks for the duration of one semester) **and a clinical course** (PT 2612 Advanced Case Practicum). This semester, Research Candidates may fulfill this clinical requirement by enrolling in **PT 210 Forming and Maintaining a Modern Analytic Group**. PT 2612 Advanced Case Practicum meets six times during the semester, approximately every other week. Case discussions focus on unconscious motivation and issues that arise in the middle and later phases of treatment. PT 210 Forming and Maintaining a Modern Analytic Group will meet every week of the semester, for 12 class meetings.

When the Research Candidate has an idea for a research proposal approved by the PT 524 instructor or the PT 527 Research Supervisor, a 3-5-page written description of it is submitted to the Research Committee for approval. Upon approval, Research Candidates officially begin working on the final paper. The CMPS Handbook for the Single-Case Study (2010 revision) specifies the complete protocol for writing the final paper.

Final Semester fee for Research Candidates

Until their final semester, Research Candidates pay a minimum total in tuition and fees of \$1775 per semester: \$750 for PT 524/527, \$400 for PT 2612, \$525 for PT 490 Referral Service Semiannual Lab Fee, and \$100 for the registration fee.

When the Research Supervisor determines that the final paper is ready for approval, the Research Candidate pays the **Research Reading Fee of \$390**. This covers the cost of final approval of the paper by the second and third readers, two members of the Research Committee other than the Research Supervisor.

Leave of Absence

Students who are unable to register for the Fall semester but who wish to maintain their enrolled status write a letter requesting a leave of absence to the Director of Advisement explaining why they are electing to take a leave. They mark "*Maintaining Matriculation*" on the registration form and return it with the \$100.00 Maintaining Matriculation fee. Maintaining Matriculation will ensure all Center mailings, journal, and library use. Students on leave of absence should continue in PT 7.

Work/Study Program

The Center offers a number of Work/Study internships. Students wishing tuition assistance and who will be available for 4 -10 hours per week during the Fall semester may apply for a Work/Study internship with the Director, Mr. Lieber. Areas available will be: Referral Service, library, office work, and computer website assistance. Candidates are paid at an hourly rate. Up to 50% tuition remission can be awarded depending on the skills necessary to fulfill the Work/Study requirements.

Assigned Readings

Please be aware that many classes have a reading assigned for the first class meeting. Please check the reading list for the classes for which you have registered so you can be prepared for the first class.

Library Copier Access

The library has two copiers for student use. Copies (and prints) cost 10¢ each. Students establish an account and set up a five-digit password with the librarian in order to use the machines.

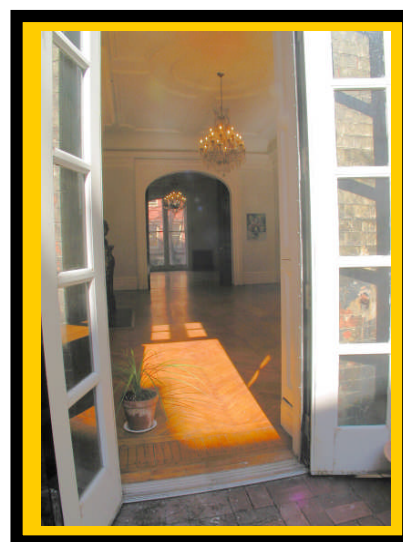
