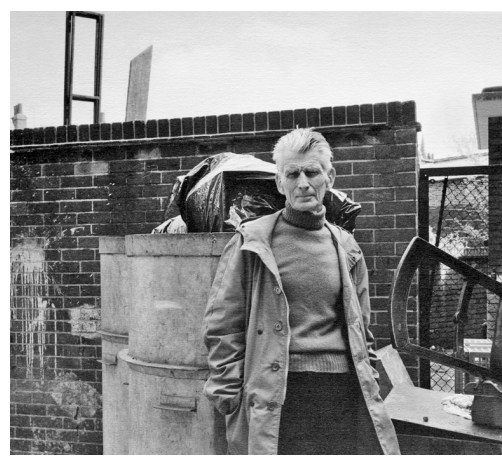

A classic borderline personality, Monroe's complex transference and Greenson's unconscious collusion are examined. Other aspects of the icon's primitive conflicts manifested in her famous and profoundly disturbing behaviors are analyzed.

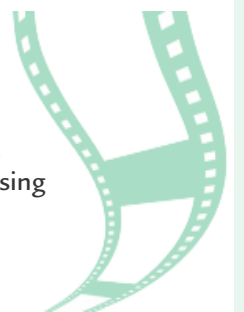
Sunday Brunch & Film
