Drawing: A Study in Meaningful Coincidence

Four people, who are otherwise unconnected, come together and begin to interact in ways that appear to be based on a common traumatic past. Unknown to each other, three of them are recovering from the suicide of a loved one. The story of their interactions raises the question of what (other than chance) could draw them together. Themes of unconscious communication, premonition, and possession are discussed and scientific attempts to account for meaningful coincidence are considered.

Allison Faye grew up in Germany and studied art in Israel at the Bezallel Academy.


She has been a gallery and museum curator of contemporary and historical art.
