


Forrest Bess: Art, Sex, and Madness

FORREST BESS (1911-1977) lived most of his life as a bait fisherman on a remote bayou on the Gulf Coast of Texas. In the two-room shack that served as his studio, he produced a unique body of work as a painter, describing himself as a "visionary" artist and

his tiny canvases as "abstract primitive." He was discovered by the pioneer New York art dealer Betty Parsons and showed alongside Jackson Pollock and Mark Rothko, among other notable Abstract Expressionists. Considering himselfa "peculiar type of homosexual,"

he became obsessed with becoming a hermaphrodite and had two genital surgeries to enable him to be sexually penetrated by another man. This talk presents his art, tells the story of his life, and describes his progression from obsession to delusional insanity. Dr Poser's presentation is based on his recently published e-book, *Though This Be Madness*.

STEVEN POSER, PhD, LP is a faculty member and training analyst at CMPS. He has contributed articles and reviews to the journal Modern Psychoanalysis, including "Finding a Shape: The Creation of Psychic Structure in a Psychoanalytic Setting" and "The Unconscious Motivation to Become a Murderer in Camus' The Stranger." An exhibiting painter since 1991, Dr Poser has shown in twelve one-person and fourteen group shows. In 1997, he received the Gradiva Award in painting from NAAP, and in 1998 was Visiting Artist at the Boston University College of Fine Arts. He is a psychoanalyst in NYC and has a studio in the Hudson Valley.
