Course Description

This course will enable students to obtain a clear grasp of modern theory of treatment, from the point of first contact between analyst and patient, through to the development and varying stages of transference, countertransference and resistance. The emphasis will be on affective communication, the therapeutic use of feelings, psychodynamic diagnosis, the attitude of the analyst, and analysis of the countertransference and induced feelings.

Objectives:

- Describe the concepts underlying the modern psychoanalytic approach to beginning treatment;
- Define the pivotal aspects of the contact function in all phases of analysis: enumerate the range of modern psychoanalytic techniques of ego insulation and reinforcement;
- Identify and describe the management and resolution of resistances;
- Explain how to analyze silently; assess and describe patient's patterns of frustration tolerance and impulse control as a guide to diagnosis;
- Examine transference phenomenon and distinguish differences of levels along the continuum of narcissistic to object transferences;
- Demonstrate how verbal and nonverbal interventions can be derived from analysis of induced countertransference reactions and utilized to establish and work through narcissistic and object transference; and
- Describe the modern psychoanalytic approach to dream material.

Method of Evaluation
